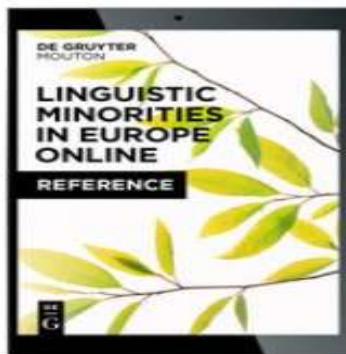

New database on linguistic minorities in Europe – test it now!

Do you study and research European languages? Our new database, *Linguistic Minorities in Europe Online (LME)*, provides comprehensive documentation of indigenous and immigrated linguistic minorities in Europe.

All articles in LME are enriched with metadata that enable specific searches, including the name of the language, country/region, language family, keywords and language examples.

The content is **heavily interlinked** so that users can quickly switch from overview articles to more detailed research articles. In addition, LME articles link out to selected external online resources.



What else makes this database so unique?

- Approximately **75% of the content is written specifically and only for LME**, while the rest is groundbreaking research from the De Gruyter archives
- Multimedia elements such as audio files, videos, maps and photographs are included
- Complete **primary sources** (e.g. annotated texts, voice recordings and transcriptions, glossaries, corpora, field notes etc.) can be published in LME
- It is co-published with the **Center for Multilingualism in Society across the Lifespan (MultiLing)** of the University of Oslo

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The database will officially be published in 2020, with a total of 100 articles and numerous primary sources on minority languages including **Basque, Frisian, Croatian, Sami, Turkish and Hungarian**. Thereafter 50 articles will be added annually, in two-yearly updates.
