Home and Leisure Time

In Great Britain people spend an average of 230 minutes a day watching television. The young and the old watch a lot more television than the middle-aged. Besides watching television, a lot of British people enjoy hobbies, such as collecting things. Young people love to collect stamps, phone cards, badges, and CDs for example. Adults generally prefer fishing, cycling, gardening or antique collecting. As regards socialising outside the home, a lot of people enjoy going to pubs (public houses). Pubs are an important part of British tradition. They are places where people can meet, chat, listen to music, play darts and, of course, have a drink. The most common drink in pubs is beer, but you can also order wine, cocktails, spirits or soft (non-alcoholic) drinks. Most pubs serve food too. Children, however, under 14 are not allowed in pubs.
